MEETING MINUTES

REGULAR MEETING, April 4, 2023, 7:00 P.M.

The Regular Meeting of the Stroud Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairwoman & Secretary, Christine A. Wilkins at 7:00 P.M. and was conducted for an in-person meeting of the Board. Also attending were Vice Chairwoman & Ass't Secretary, Jennifer Shukaitis; Supervisor/Ass't Treasurer Edward C. Cramer; Township Manager, Daryl A. Eppley; Township Engineer, Matt Evans, of Reilly Associates; Township Solicitor, Todd Weitzmann; and Recording Secretary, Janice Willey. Mrs. Wilkins began the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Comments: (Non-Agenda Items) Pat Henley wanted to let the Supervisors know he has a friend that likes to walk on Wallace Street near the pond. She is recovering from an injury and has always felt safe and this area was best for her exercising. Lately however, she has opted not to walk here because of all of the homeless people gathering around Albertson Park. The Board told Mr. Henley the nearby church's overnight shelter program has now been closed and the homeless people hanging around the park should be gone now. Also, Kenneth Hatt, Brittney Coleman, Cindy VanGilbert and Abby Jones attended the meeting to discuss an open mic event that has been happening on township owned property, CSA (Josie Porter Farm). He said he was informed that this event is on hold and would have to get permission from the Board of Supervisors to continue the event. Mr. Hatt stated they were approached by the Heidi Secord and Gary Bloss to start this event four years ago during Covid. The township was never notified or involved in any decision making at all. Mrs. Wilkins stated as per the property lease none of these activities are allowed. Mr. Cramer said something this like this would need a land development plan at the very least. This is township owned property not intended to be a concert venue and this was never the intent to make it anything other than a farm. Mr. Hatt said this is a not-for-profit/community event and is willing to make changes and submit any plans needed to continue. Ms. Coleman stated it is a special venue for the community and is willing to work with township to have it continue. Mrs. Wilkins read directly from the lease and noted all of the lease violations. Ms. Shukaitis noted there is nothing wrong with your intentions, unfortunately this is not what the farm use is about.

Mr. Eppley said their discussion included making a contribution as a committee for the township and there are always environmental issues but what are the big picture issues you'd like them to take on in the future.
